- Now it is ready for posting on Amazon with absolutely no issues. Well it is posted on Amazon and the world takes a look at it. Invariable Amazon sends a list of quality problems noted by readers. Fix, repost and the world is good. Until about two days later and more errors float in. This is usual the worst of it, though I had three passes once.
- A lot of effort and you know things won't get worse. Wrong! On book two some nice readers pointed out that I had duplicated about fifteen hundred words in chapters 18 and 19.

- The book had sold a bunch of copies with the wrong file. It was not a simple case of reposting the correct version. It was now convincing Amazon to let all the previous purchasers know that a corrected version had been uploaded and they could get it for free.
- Reading the instructions on how to do this makes you realize that Amazon won't do this lightly. As a matter of fact they have more rules saying why they won't than how to do it.
- Since my pride was on the line and a belief in good customer service I spent two days jumping through the hoops.
- Amazon came through. Within two hours of me sending my request they not only approved it but pushed out an email to all previous purchasers that they could download a corrected copy. My hats off and thanks to customer service at Amazon.
- So aside from a bruised ego from finding out I'm not perfect alls well that ends well.
